Day 1 **Alice Springs**



Transfer from Alice Springs Airport to your hotel.

Located 1.5km from the town center and 15km from the airport.
All rooms feature balconies, color televisions, tea and coffee making facilities, mini-bars, hair dryers, STD/ISD direct-dial telephones, voice mail and modem connection, irons and ironing boards.

Afternoon - Alice Springs and Surrounds

In the afternoon with your private guide, visit Emily and Jessie Gaps providing a great introduction to the Central Australia region. Both are excellent sites for desert mountain specialties such as the Little Woodswallow and Grey-headed Honeyeater. These areas are also important Aboriginal cultural sites for caterpillar and emu dreamings.

Then it is on to Simpson's Gap National Park to look for the Grey Falcon, Mulga Parrot, Golden-backed Honeyeater, Turquoise Fairy-wren, Rufous-crowned Emu-wren, Pied Butcherbird, Crested Bellbird, Zebra Finch, Painted Firetail and the elusive Dusky Grasswren. Our visit will be timed with the hope of seeing the Black-flanked Rock Wallaby colony and Simpson's Gap resident Peregrine Falcons.

Return to Alice Springs and your hotel.

Day 2 Full Day - Alice Springs and Alice Springs Desert Park

A very early morning departure for today's birding. Greet the dawn at a beautiful mature spinifex grassland site south of Alice Springs in search of the elusive Rufous-crowned Emu-wren, Spinifex Bird and *Dusky Grasswren. These birds are challenging, but at the top of every birder's Central Australian bucket list!

Late morning visit the Olive Pink Botanic Garden, a delightful historic native garden which is an excellent site for the Western Bowerbird, Splendid Fairy Wren and occasionally the Grey Honeyeater.

In the afternoon spend two hours at the Alice Springs Desert Park, one of the world's finest bioparks. All animals and plants are from within 200km of Alice Springs—a fantastic showcase of desert biodiversity. See charismatic desert animals such as the Thorny Devil, Bilby and even the extinct-in-the-wild Mala.

The Alice Springs Desert Park is also a great place for birding with frequent sightings of the Spinifex Pigeon and Painted Finch and desirable rarities such as the Slaty-backed Thornbill and Grey Honeyeater.

Return to your hotel.

Lunch included.

Day 3 Morning – Alice Springs and Surrounds

An early morning departure for the Alice Springs Water Treatment Works to view large numbers of outback nomads such as the Red-necked Avocet, Pink-eared Duck, Black-winged Stilt and Black-tailed Native Hens.

Nearby chenopod habitat hosts the Crimson Chat, White-winged Fairy Wren and occasionally the Orange Chat. Raptors often include the Little Eagle and Black Falcon.

Return to your hotel.



Transfer to Alice Springs Airport
